1 Samson went down to Timnah and saw there a young Philistine woman.

2 When he returned, he said to his father and mother, "I have seen a Philistine woman in Timnah; now get her for me as my wife."

3 His father and mother replied, "Isn't there an acceptable woman among your relatives or among all our people? Must you go to the uncircumcised Philistines to get a wife?"

But Samson said to his father, "Get her for me. She's the right one for me."

4 (His parents did not know that this was from the Lord, who was seeking an occasion to confront the Philistines; for at that time they were ruling over Israel.)





16 Then Samson's wife threw herself on him, sobbing, "You hate me! You don't really love me. You've given my people a riddle, but you haven't told me the answer."

"I haven't even explained it to my father or mother," he replied, "so why should I explain it to you?"

17 She cried the whole seven days of the feast. So on the seventh day he finally told her, because she continued to press him. She in turn explained the riddle to her people.

"Pay attention when the story repeats itself."



- 1. Samson's **strength** leads him astray
 - From the Lion Honey
 - From the Philistine Woman
 - From the Wedding drink

His bride is threatened with being burned (14:15)

Samson burns with anger (14:19)

Samson burns the fields (15:5)

Philistines burn his bride and her family alive (15:6)


Power to Develop – 1 Cor. 12:4-11

Romans 8:15-17

14 For those who are led by the Spirit of God are the children of God. 15 The Spirit you received does not make you slaves, so that you live in fear again; rather, the Spirit you received brought about your adoption to sonship. And by him we cry, "Abba, Father."

16 The Spirit himself testifies with our spirit that we are God's children.



Romans 7:14-25

- ...19 For I do not do the good I want to do, but the evil I do not want to do—this I keep on doing.
- 20 Now if I do what I do not want to do, it is no longer I who do it, but it is sin living in me that does it.
- **21** So I find this law at work: Although I want to do good, evil is right there with me...

Romans 8:1-4

1 Therefore, there is now no condemnation for those who are in Christ Jesus, 2 because through Christ Jesus the law of the Spirit who gives life has set you free from the law of sin and death. 3 For what the law was powerless to do because it was weakened by the flesh

Romans 8:1-4

...God did by sending his own Son in the likeness of sinful flesh to be a sin offering. And so he condemned sin in the flesh, 4 in order that the righteous requirement of the law might be fully met in us, who do not live according to the flesh but according to the Spirit.
